## Monarch and Pollinators Mini-grants

Find a space, grab a shovel, and become part of the effort to save the Monarch butterfly! Missouri 4-H is proud to continue Monarch Habitat Demonstration Project Mini-grants, a cooperative effort of Missouri Department of Conservation, Grow Native! retailers and Missouri 4-H; funded by the Missouri Conservation Heritage Foundation. This project provides \$50 mini-grants to 4-H Clubs or members across the state *to plant and maintain monarch habitat gardens on highly visible public properties* such as county courthouses, city parks, fairgrounds, school grounds, highway right-of-ways, etc.

4-H clubs/project leaders/members will be issued \$50 vouchers by the state 4-H office that can be redeemed at GrowNative! plant retailers covering up to ½ of the cost of landscape plantings *for each 100 square feet of habitat (~the footprint of a large SUV)*. ## Richland Rebels Plant the Liberty Tree

Congratulations! The Richland Rebels 4-H group was selected as a recipient for one of the Liberty Trees. It is such an honor to have a piece of history right here in Stoddard County.

The original Liberty Tree was a famous elm tree that stood near Boston Common during the Revolutionary era. In 1765, the Sons of Liberty, a group of American colonists, staged the first act of defiance against British rule under the tree. This spawned the resistance that eventually led to the American Revolutionary War. During the war, several other towns designated their own Liberty Trees as support for the resistance spread throughout the colonies. These Liberty Trees became symbols of American independence.

The last original Liberty Tree, a Tulip Poplar, stood on the grounds of St. John's College in Annapolis, Md. Until 1999 when it dies during Hurricane Floyd. Prior to its death, 14 seedlings were successfully germinated from the tree through a project spearheaded by the nonprofit conservation organization American Forests. The seedlings were planted throughout the original 13 colonies.

In order to further preserve the legacy of the Liberty Trees, a bud-grafting program was launched, through which several bud-grafted trees were grown. Thanks to the generosity of Crader Distributing and local STIHL dealers, these bud-grafted trees will be donated to Missouri 4-H clubs to be planted in public spaces throughout Missouri. The trees are 4 foot Tulip Poplar seedlings.



## Missouri 4-H Shooting Sports Ambassador Program

Last year at this time, we announced the Missouri Shooting Sports Ambassador program. We selected 16 youth members from across the state having at least one representative in each region. Some of our goals in this program are to:

- Further develop their skills in leadership, public presentation, citizenship, community service, public relations and team building.

## how to make Ice Cream in a bag



### Easy Ice Cream In A Bag

- ¼ Cup of Milk
- ¼ Cup of Half and Half
- 1 Tablespoon white sugar
- ¼ Teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 Cup ice cubes
- 3 Tablespoon ice cream rock salt

#### Directions

1. Combine milk, half-and-half, sugar, and vanilla extract in a pint-size resealable plastic bag; seal tightly.
2. Put a scoop of ice, 3 tablespoons ice cream rock salt, and the bag containing the milk-cream mixture into a gallon-size resealable plastic bag; seal tightly.
3. Rock the bag back and forth (do not shake) until contents thicken into ice cream, about 10 minutes. Wipe salt from the top of the pint-size bag before opening to prevent salt from getting into the ice cream.
