Getting to the Extension Center

From Interstate 44

(traveling from Springfield/Lebanon): Take the Marshfield exit (Exit 100) and go south 1.5 miles on Highway 38 to 4-way stop, turn right and cross railroad tracks. At stop sign, turn right onto Highway A and go 0.4 mile to red brick building just south of City Hall on east (left) side of road.

From Highway A (traveling from Rogersville/Fordland/Seymour): Follow Highway A north into Marshfield, past Fraker Funeral Home and Marshfield Christian Church to red brick building just north of the Country Mart convenience store on east (right) side of road (0.3 mile inside city limits).

From Highway 38

(traveling from Hartville):
Follow Highway 38 west into Marshfield, past MFA on right and Marshfield Community Center on left. Road curves south around brick building. Follow it 0.4 mile to red brick building just south of City Hall on east (left) side of road.

Program Priorities & Guidance

County residents decide the direction of our educational programming. Current emphasis areas center around agricultural sustainability and food production: wise use of natural resources: adult and youth development; health and safety; community emergency preparedness; and small business development and marketing.

The Extension Council is a legally-mandated advisory board consisting of 16 elected and appointed citizens of Webster County. These volunteers oversee the fiscal matters, personnel, and educational programs of the Center.

How We Are Funded

Funding is a partnership of federal, state and county appropriations, plus grants, contracts, user fees and private donations. Each partner's support is critical for the success of our work.

The University of Missouri & Lincoln University, plus targeted grants, pays the salaries of Extension specialists and program assistants assigned to Webster County. County funds are expected to pay for secretarial support, office space and supplies, communications, equipment upkeep, and travel expenses.

To maintain current services, annual county funding of \$79,000 is needed. This equates to \$2.11 per Webster County resident per year. Current county appropriations cover just \$48,508.
