Dear 4-H Families,

In reflecting on the month of February and thinking about President's Day and the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and George Washington, an illustration came to mind from Paul Lee Tan's Encyclopedia of Illustrations entitled, "The Song America."

"One bleak day in February 1832, a young theological student sat in his room at Andover Seminary, Samuel Francis Smith was going over a sheaf of German songs for children, given him by a friend, the composer Lowell Mason. Sunset shadows crept into the room and Smith was tired from a strenuous day of study. He was relieved to spend a few relaxed moments going over his friend's music.

As he hummed over one after another, one struck his fancy. He glanced at the words at the bottom of the page and his knowledge of German told him that the words were patriotic, but they did not appeal to him. He decided to write his own words. He searched around on his desk until he found a scrap of paper, about five or six inches long and two and one half inches wide. On this, as he tapped out the rhythm of the music, he began to write,

My country, tis of thee, Sweet land of liberty, Of thee I sing, Land where my fathers died, Land of the pilgrims' pride, From every mountain side Let freedom ring."

It is no coincidence that the song we now refer to as "America" was composed during the very patriotic month of February.

In 4-H we learn about patriotism through the reciting of the pledge of allegiance, learning proper flag etiquette (how to properly display, fold and retire it from service, the meaning behind the colors), and learning patriotic songs at club meetings and camp. We learn that freedom includes the price of people giving their lives in service of this country.

It is through the proper appreciation of the sacrifices of the former generations that we can fully appreciate the freedoms we have today. Let Freedom Ring.

As "keepers of the clover," we are responsible for ensuring that all aspects of the 4-H program are of the highest quality and in accordance with approved 4-H policies.

Good financial management is an important aspect of our responsibility to 4-H. Since 1998, the required financial policies for any Missouri 4-H organization (clubs, county councils, committees and other groups that use the 4-H name) have been laid out in the publication Missouri 4-H Treasurer's Record Book Y672.

All entities (clubs, councils, committees) that use the 4-H name MUST use this record book and meet or exceed the policies outlined in this publication.

IMPORTANT—Please read

² All enrollments should have been submitted. If you haven't please do so ASAP.

If you are showing incomplete and it's something you can't seem to resolve give us a call.

If you are still showing pending in the system, chances are we have not received your member dues. Until dues are received you will not show as an 'active' 4-H member. See timeline.

If you paid your club leader, please verify with her that dues have been submitted to the office.

Until you are active in the system, you will not show up on any project report for project leaders. Which means meetings may be held without you.

Enrollment timeline:

Image Member enrolls online. If all sections are completed then member is in 'pending' status. If the status is 'incomplete' and you think that you have entered all information and **submitted** it, please call the office and we can help you through it.

Pay by credit card or check (if paying by check, make sure to get your dues to your club leader at the **next meeting**).

It club leaders get the dues to the office ASAP. Please do not hold on to them thinking you will turn them all in at once.

After dues are received in the office, we (county office) review/approve enrollment and members are set to 'active' status.

Paying by credit card speeds up the activation process. Once the credit card is approved, we review the enrollment and approve/activate the member.

I Volunteer club or project leader must complete/submit to the county office an A nnual Background Check Consent Form LG639. After the background check has been approved, volunteer has enrolled online and the one-time volunteer orientation is complete, then we are able to set you as 'active'. Until all of these steps are met, project leaders cannot hold project meetings.

Ince everything is processed, club/volunteer leaders will have access to their members in 4-H online. If you have further questions, please contact the county office.

New State Fair Guidelines

Scrapbooking exhibits should be a 1 page/1 side representative of the complete scrapbook.

Size not to exceed 12"x12".

All pages should be in clear protective sleeve or clear zipper bag.

Do not frame scrapbook page.

If more than one page is submitted for an exhibit, the exhibit will be disqualified.

Educational Display depth is going back to 6 inches.

Exhibit tags need to be attached to perishable items such as food, vegetables and crops.

The Cardinals will be playing the Philadelphia Phillies in a 1:15 p.m. game. Tickets for the game will be \$25.00 each and includes a specially designed t-shirt featuring the 4-H Clover on the back and the Cardinals emblem on the front.

4-H members, leaders, alumni, and their families who purchase 4-H Day with the Cardinals tickets will have the opportunity to participate in a parade around the Busch Stadium outfield. Pre-game ceremonies will include a recitation of the 4-H pledge and ceremonial first pitches by an Illinois and Missouri 4-H member. As an added bonus the Cardinals give-away item for the game is a replica 1968 National League Championship ring. The first 30,000 fans age 16 and older will receive this one-of-a-kind item.

Tickets for the event must be ordered on the 4-H Day with the Cardinals order form. Ticket order forms are available on the web at www.mo4h.missouri.edu. Ticket orders must be postmarked by April 9, 2018. Tickets usually sell out before the order deadline so families are encouraged to order early. 4-H Clubs, counties, or groups of families who would like to be seated together must send their orders in the same envelope.

The clinic is designed for participants in 8th grade or younger and will focus on hands-on learning, working in small groups to learn more about the basics of livestock evaluation, and understanding the importance of USDA grading of cattle. The contest will provide students the ability to develop and test their skills in a contest-like setting.
