Unless noted, all of these scholarships require recipients to enroll at Mizzou the first semester after high school graduation. Some scholarships are subject to change without notice. They are not to be regarded as offers to contract. Awards from all sources (federal, state, institutional or private aid) may not exceed the annual cost of attendance assigned by MU. Scholarships requiring a separate application (including the MU Annual Scholarship Application, Stamps, Brooks, Mizzou Scholars, and all Scholars & Fellows programs in the Honors College) have a due date of Dec. 1. The recommended date to apply for Admission to meet this deadline is Nov. 15.

† The cost of attendance presented is a standardized estimate of various university charges and educational expenses. These costs do not include estimates for books, supplies, residence hall fees and any personal expenses. Amounts are subject to change at any time. However, any tuition or fee increases must be approved by the University of Missouri Board of Curators 30 days prior to the beginning of the academic term. Any approved revision of tuition and fees is effective regardless of whether they have been paid prior to the revision.

Diversity Award	Missouri resident: \$2,500 Nonresident: 100% nonresident fee waiver (approximately \$16,680)	Membership in a racial or ethnic minority group that is underrepresented in relation to the university's goal to achieve education benefits of a diverse student body	Recipients are automatically screened upon admission and selected based on high school class rank, ACT or SAT scores, and grades in college prep courses.

SAVE \$16,000+ A YEAR WITH LOWER, IN-STATE TUITION.

THE BASICS OF MISSOURI RESIDENCY:

- Live in Missouri for 12 consecutive months (August–August)
- Missouri Driver's License
- Missouri voter registration
- Job in Missouri earning at least \$2,000 of taxable income
- Student cannot be claimed as a dependent on a federal income tax return in another state.

MORE ABOUT GAINING RESIDENCY:

- Residency takes one full year, which may start when you begin classes in August of your freshman year.
- You'll be paying nonresident tuition until you are granted residency.
- You can still receive a nonresident scholarship while going through the residency process. Once you become a Missouri resident, you will no longer receive the scholarship.
- You must fill out a petition and provide all required documentation.

FOLLOW THESE STEPS TO MAXIMIZE YOUR FINANCIAL AID

- 1 Apply for admission to be considered for automatic scholarships. For maximum scholarship consideration, apply to Mizzou by Nov. 15 of your senior year.
- 2 To be considered for general and departmental scholarships, complete the MU Annual Scholarship Application by Dec. 1. Competitive scholarships have specific deadlines, so watch your email for important info.
- 3 For loans and grants, submit your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by Feb. 1 for priority consideration. Some scholarships require you to submit your FAFSA before the general priority date.
