## **COVID-19: Cleaning Equipment and Touch-Surfaces**

## Proper cleaning regimens lead to safe equipment

- Open cab windows and doors for ventilation while cleaning.
- Wear disposable gloves when cleaning and disinfecting.
- Clean dirty surfaces using soap and water prior to disinfection.
- Disinfect frequently touched surfaces.
  - Keep a cleaning kit in equipment and vehicles: gloves, mask, hand cleaner and hand sanitizer.
  - O Disinfect door handles, gear knobs, steering wheel, armrests, grab handles, seat adjusters, buttons and touch screens. Consider use of screen protectors for electronics.
  - o Do not forget exterior surfaces: seed box lids, hoses, hitch-pins, jack handles, etc.
- Wash hands before and after operating equipment. It is a good habit, regardless of COVID-19, to keep frequently touched surfaces in your tractor from looking dingy.
- When buying machinery from a dealership: Ask for interiors to be cleaned and disinfected before a test drive or purchase. Take personal responsibility, after delivery, to clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces.
- When inspecting used machinery for purchase: Wear disposable gloves and mask before touching or entering a cab. Use hand sanitizer immediately after.
- When taking equipment in for repairs: Ask for interiors to be cleaned and disinfected after repairs are made. Take personal responsibility, after delivery, to clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces.

## Safe cleaning products for equipment cab interiors:

- Soap and water are safe for most machinery interiors.
  - Clean dirty surfaces before disinfecting. Disinfectants are not effective on greasy, dirty surfaces.
  - o Vigorous washing with soap and water can destroy coronavirus.
  - o Do not use excessive water or soap on fabric. This could create mold issues.
  - o Use a conditioner after cleaning leather.
- 70% or greater alcohol solutions can be used on nearly every interior surface of a tractor.
  - o Repeated usage of alcohol can damage and discolor leather.
  - o Use of bleach or hydrogen peroxide may damage upholstery.
- Electronics
  - o First, clean with a damp microfiber cloth.
  - Then, disinfect using a 70% alcohol wipe. Do not use ammonia-based cleaners on touch screens.
  - o Regularly clean portable electronic devices: laptops, tablets, memory sticks.
