What to Do	What to Say
Chart #1	Review main elements of a good demonstration from Y744 Let's Demonstrate.
Demonstration cards	Project leaders may want to add cards specific to a project area.
Demonstration bag and props	Have a volunteer or assigned 4-H member draw the card from the grab bag. The person will then demonstrate what is on the card (reference the poster to check for good format).

<p>Wash your face</p> <p>Prop: soap, water, wash cloth, and towel</p>	<p>Repot a plant</p> <p>Prop: plant, new pot, potting soil, and water</p>	<p>Make a glass of Chocolate Milk</p> <p>Prop: milk, cup, spoon, chocolate</p>
<p>Draw a square</p> <p>Prop: marker and paper</p>	<p>Do a push up</p>	<p>Put on a jacket or coat</p> <p>Prop: jacket or coat</p>

<p>Blow bubbles</p> <p>Prop: bubble soap and wand</p>	<p>Tie a shoe</p> <p>Prop: tie shoe or cardboard replica</p>	<p>Set a table</p> <p>Prop: plate, fork, knife, spoon, napkin, glass</p>
<p>Make a paper airplane</p> <p>Prop: sheet of paper</p>	<p>Brush your teeth</p> <p>Prop: toothbrush and toothpaste</p>	<p>Place photo in frame</p> <p>Prop: photo and frame</p>
<p>Measure a cup of water</p> <p>Prop: liquid measuring cup and water</p>	<p>Braid hair or rope</p> <p>Prop: volunteer with long hair or 3 pieces of rope</p>	<p>Unwrap gum</p> <p>Prop: gum (dispose of wrapper properly)</p>

<p>Shuffle a deck of cards</p> <p>Prop: deck of cards</p>	<p>Wrap a gift</p> <p>Prop: box, wrapping paper, tape, scissors</p>	<p>Make a paper fan</p> <p>Prop: paper</p>
<p>Make a Kleenex carnation</p> <p>Prop: Kleenex and pipe cleaner</p>	<p>Peel an Orange</p> <p>Prop: orange and a peeler or a spoon</p>	<p>Wipe a table</p> <p>Prop: table and cloth</p>
<p>Sharpen a pencil</p> <p>Prop: Pencil and sharpener</p>	<p>Tie a neck tie</p> <p>Prop: Neck tie and volunteer</p>	<p>Shine your shoes</p> <p>Prop: shoe and shine materials</p>
<p>Crack an egg for cooking</p> <p>Prop: egg, bowl, knife, towels</p>	<p>Separate the yolk from the white of an egg</p> <p>Prop: egg, bowl, towels</p>	<p>Measure 2/3 cup of flour</p> <p>Prop: measuring cups, flour, bowl</p>
<p>Cut a 4 ½ "board</p> <p>Prop: board, hand saw, measuring tape, pencil</p>	<p>Make a peanut butter and jelly sandwich</p> <p>Prop: peanut butter, jelly, bread, knife, plate</p>	<p>Curl ribbon for a gift</p> <p>Prop: different ribbons and scissors</p>
<p>Tie a square knot</p> <p>Prop: rope and directions</p>	<p>Paint your fingernails</p> <p>Prop: nail polish, remover, volunteer</p>	<p>Peel a banana</p> <p>Prop: banana</p>

Elements of a Good Demonstration

- Introduction
 - Topic suitable to your age and experience
- Body
 - Plan the demonstration
 - Collect materials need
 - Develop an outline
- Summary
 - Main points to remember
 - Display finished product
 - Clean up
- Questions
 - Ask for questions
 - Repeat question prior to answering.
 - Add a courteous ending
