Awards Certificates: 4-H clubs will receive a color “seal” certificate based on the average number of hours all club members and volunteers spent on club community service projects (**PURPLE** = 10+ service hours; **BLUE** = 7.5-9.9 service hours; **RED** = 5.0-7.4 service hours; and **WHITE** = 0.1-4.9 service hours).
