



MISSOURI 4-H CIVIC ENGAGEMENT AMBASSADOR 2024-2025 APPLICATION

The purpose of the Missouri 4-H Civic Engagement Ambassador Program is to educate local policy makers, industry stakeholders, community partners, and 4-H'ers at the county and regional levels on the topics of land-grant history, 4-H program offerings, and service-learning opportunities. Through this program, 4-H'ers selected as ambassadors can expect to develop meaningful professional connections throughout multiple levels of the public as they seek to educate others on ways to engage with Extension and to positively contribute to their communities. Ambassadors are paramount to further connecting 4-H'ers with each other throughout the state and to developing social capital with individuals and entities directly and indirectly invested in the land-grant mission of the University of Missouri and the 4-H motto to Make the Best Better.

Ambassadors are expected to engage with local policymakers that include county commission boards and local school boards. In addition, they are asked to liaise with 4-H'ers and 4-H faculty in their region through county meetings, regional energizers, and service projects. Ambassadors will plan and preside over Missouri 4-H Teen Conference. In addition, they will be invited to represent Missouri 4-H at statewide events including but not limited to the Missouri State Fair, Legislative Academy, and State Congress. An ambassador's term begins at Missouri 4-H State Congress and lasts a calendar year from that event.

The learning objectives for the Missouri 4-H Civic Engagement Ambassadors are

1. To generate social capital among their youth peers, 4-H faculty and staff, University of Missouri officials, policymakers, and other key stakeholder groups,
2. To employ civic engagement skills in service-based learning activities with peer and adult partnerships,
3. To enhance self-efficacy as a teacher, communicator, and Extension advocate, and
4. To incorporate the seven behaviors of servant leaders into their leadership activities.

QUALIFICATIONS: Any Missouri 4-H'er that is entering grades 9-12 at time of application is eligible to serve as a Missouri 4-H Civic Engagement Ambassador. The Missouri 4-H Center for Youth Development is a welcoming space, and we invite all persons regardless of background, race/ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity/expression, religious or philosophical beliefs to apply for this position. Furthermore, we are thrilled to see applicants from both rural and urban backgrounds in addition to 4-H'ers from all school settings, be they public, private, charter, magnate, or homeschooled. Applicants must be currently enrolled in a Missouri 4-H program area at the time of application and must remain enrolled in at least one Missouri 4-H program area during their time in office if elected. Additionally, an academic reference form as proof of good standing in schoolwork will be submitted as a part of this application packet. Applicants do not need to have previously served in a leadership role at the county or state level, though it is encouraged. All applicants are expected to have some record of volunteering and community service.

REQUIREMENTS DURING TIME IN OFFICE

As outlined in the purpose of Missouri 4-H Civic Engagement Ambassador Program, if selected, 4-H'ers that serve in this role will be expected to take on a variety of leadership opportunities during their term. There are four mandatory events that all ambassadors must attend during their year of service. These events are NON-NEGOTIABLE. Failure to attend and actively participate in these events will result in immediate dismissal from the Missouri 4-H Civic Engagement Ambassadors Program.

Mandatory Events:

- Attending 2024 Missouri 4-H Congress to be installed as an ambassador (In-person, Columbia, MO): May 29-May 31
- Attending Missouri 4-H Civic Engagement Ambassador Training (In-person, Columbia, MO): Dates TBD
- Attending Ambassador Meetings: Dates TBD
- Planning/participating in 2025 Missouri 4-H Teen Conference (in-person, Columbia, Missouri): Dates TBD

Ambassadors will also serve several purposes that are unique to the Missouri 4-H Civic Engagement Ambassador Program. This singularity stands out both within the context of Missouri 4-H and other ambassador programs nationally. Missouri 4-H Civic Engagement Ambassadors are expected to

- Present land-grant history and 4-H program offerings presentation to county board of commissioners' meetings in three counties within their region.
- Provide a monthly update presentation at their home county board of commissioners' meeting.
 - Provide monthly updates to their county on service-learning opportunities and local policymaker meetings.
- Present land-grant and 4-H program offerings presentation to an industry stakeholder in their county (e.g., Farm Bureau or Soybean Association) once per fall and spring.
- Plan and facilitate one service-learning project per semester (Fall/Spring) for their county.
- Facilitate at least one workshop (planned by the 4-H'er) to their county per semester (fall/spring); topic will be approved by Leadership and Civic Engagement specialist and educator.

COST: Ambassadors will have their Ambassador Meetings costs covered. Lodging and some meals will be provided. Travel costs are not subject reimbursement. There is no travel stipend for serving on the Missouri 4-H Civic Engagement Ambassador. All ambassadors will receive a polo and a nametag.

HOW TO APPLY:

There will be 20 total ambassadors selected for the year. Four candidates will be selected at-large. The remaining sixteen ambassadors will be selected with two representatives from each Extension region. In the event that the minimum of two qualified applicants per Extension region is not met, the position in-question may be filled by at-large selection from the remaining pool of applicants. Submit this completed application and any supporting documents to both Ms. Megan Kershner, Missouri 4-H Leadership and Civic Engagement Educator and Dr. J. "Clay" Hurdle, Assistant Professor and 4-H State Specialist in Leadership and Civic Engagement, via e-mail on or before February 1, 2024 at 5 p.m. CST: Ms. Kershner (mkershner@missouri.edu) and Dr. Hurdle (jhurdle@missouri.edu). E-mail is the preferred medium for submission, but paper applications may be mailed to the State 4-H office c/o Ms. Megan Kershner. Applications received after the deadline will not be considered.

*When submitting electronically, please note that for the signature page of this application, you will need to scan or screenshot a photo of the three signatures required and submit that in the same e-mail with the rest of this completed document.

Please include your

1. Completed application form,
2. Academic reference form,
3. Minimum of two reference forms (one 4-H Staff or faculty and one from a professional reference).

Applications will be reviewed by a professional selection panel. Applicants will be notified of their status no later than March 15th, 2024, at 5 p.m. CDT. Notifications will be distributed via e-mail. Please be sure to check your junk/spam folder if you have not received anything in your standard inbox by that time. New ambassadors will be officially recognized and installed during the 2024 Missouri 4-H State Congress.
