Short Essay Questions

Applicants will submit answers for three short essay questions. Answers for each question should be 100-200 words.

- 1. Please share your 4-H experience, emphasizing your how 4-H has impacted your personal growth and development.
- 2. Why do you want to attend Citizenship Washington Focus? Please describe what you hope to gain from the experience and how you will share this information when you return home.
- 3. Citizenship Washington Focus visits a variety of monuments while in Washington, D.C. Which of these would you be most interested in seeing and why?

Answers to the essay questions will be judged on the following criteria:

- 4-H Experience (30 points)
 - Personally reflected on their educational/learning experiences in 4-H
 - Described the benefit of 4-H in their life and the ways they have grown and developed in the 4-H program
- Interest in Citizenship Washington Focus (30 points)
 - Clearly explains interest in Citizenship Washington Focus program
 - Demonstrates understanding of how they will share program information
- Most interesting monument (30 points)
 - Connects selected monument to personal interest
- Organization (10 points)
 - Conveys a clear message
 - Thoughts are concise and well organized

Scholarship Questions

Two scholarships of \$1,250 will be available to applicants. Applicants interested in state level scholarships will be asked the following questions in addition to the short essay questions.

- 1. Please explain any special circumstances that warrant consideration to provide financial assistance for Citizenship Washington Focus?
- 2. Have you researched other funding sources? If yes, what other funding sources are you pursuing in addition to this scholarship?
