Supplies Needed:

Situation and Option card, 4-H judging cards, Judging Scale Chart, and pencils.

Suggested Age: 14 & up

Reasons:

- D would be the best option because Brittany would not be breaking the rules and her parents could help her see if there are hidden fees or if it is a good offer.
- C would be the next best option because Brittany would still be consulting her parents; however, it probably is not important enough to interrupt her dad's work.
- A would be the next option because Brittany would be breaking the rules and using her parents' credit card without permission.
- B would be the worst because Brittany would be breaking the rules, getting her friend in trouble and using someone else's parents' credit card. They could both get in trouble for that.

Situation:

Brittany wants to download some cell phone ring tones on-line. She is not allowed to use the Internet when her parents are not home.
