Supplies Needed:

Situation and Option cards, 4-H judging cards, Judging Scale Chart and pencils.

Reasons:

- B is over C because weekly combing will keeps its coat in good condition and help prevent. Since it is easy to cut a cat's skin when removing mats, it is best to have a professional groomer do it.
- C is better than A because a Persian cat's long hair requires combing more frequently than once a month. But on the other hand, the part about cutting out the mats can lead to injuries.
- A is over **D** because at least you comb occasionally, even if not often enough. Mats can cause skin problems, so they do need to be removed carefully.
- D is last because hair on Persian cats is too long for them to maintain themselves







Judging Class Cats Grooming

Situation:

Brittney's 2 year old Persian cat is in need of some grooming. Please rank the following grooming methods from best to worst.

Options:

- **A.** Comb the cat monthly. Avoid pulling on mats, as this will irritate the skin (and the cat)
- **B.** Comb the cat at least once a week. If it is matted, take it to a groomer for 'dematting'
- C. Comb your cat once a week, cut out mats carefully with scissors
- **D.** Don't comb your Persian Cat. They will groom themselves.
