Supplies Needed:

Photos of items or real items, Situation and Option card, 4-H judging cards, Judging Scale Chart and pencils

Reasons: A, C, D, B

A better than **C** because of the tartar control, balanced ingredients, and portion control is easy; **C** is higher calorie than needed.

C better than **D** because it is designed for cats, but the extra calories are not needed; table scraps is not appropriate for cats and may lead to begging at the table.

D better than **B** because the meat, potatoes, and vegetables may be ok for cat, where as the chocolate chips and peanuts are dangerous for most animals.

Select from best to worst, thinking of nutrition, their age and weight, as well as safety issues.

Options:

- A.** 4-H Tartar Control Crunchy Cat Treats (Protein: 27%, fiber, 3.5%, fat, 13%, moisture 10%) corn, wheat, poultry by products meal, etc but no sugar or artificial flavors)

- B.** Peanuts and chocolate chips

- C.** Super Charger Gel (for dogs and cats who won't eat)

- D.** Table scraps
