About Connecting Entrepreneurial Communities

Entrepreneurial communities are neighborhoods, cities, and counties that continuously work to facilitate economic development through entrepreneurship. They strategically build and grow networks, cultures, resources, and policies that enable invention, innovation, and entrepreneurship to succeed. University of Missouri Extension created the Connecting Entrepreneurial Communities (CEC) program to help communities build and grow these resources. CEC does this by acting as a platform for economic developers, local government officials, and other practitioners to come together to share best practices, learn from successes, and sometimes failures; but, always with the intent to exchange ideas.

About the CEC Conference

The CEC Conference is offered by University of Missouri (MU) Extension Business and Communities. The CEC Conference is hosted annually in a rural community in Missouri. Hosting a conference offers rural communities throughout Missouri the opportunity to attract participants from Missouri and across the United States who are interested in connecting with and learning from other entrepreneurial individuals. The Conference is an opportunity for small, rural communities to showcase their downtown businesses, entrepreneurs, and other assets to potential investors, funding agencies, entrepreneurs, newcomers, and state organizations.

Why Should You Submit a Proposal to Present?

We're seeking breakout session speakers and facilitators who can share their knowledge in a way that deeply connects with participants and helps build capacity to drive positive economic impact in Missouri and other communities across the United States! Your expertise, personal experiences, and successful strategies in navigating obstacles and change can have positive impact on your participants, providing them with the tools they need to thrive in an increasingly challenging, global economy. Your session will be 30-40 minutes in length and held in one of the quaint storefronts in charming downtown Excelsior Springs. Your audience will be made up of economic developers, business owners, arts and cultural enthusiasts, government leaders, philanthropists, educators, and those in the non-profit sector - all of whom play a significant role in the success of businesses and entrepreneurial development in rural communities. Sessions are presented on the afternoon of October 1, and during the morning of October 2, 2025.

The 2025 CEC Conference has Four (4) Sub-Themes

Each of the four sub-theme is informed by a guiding question. Please read through the following themes. You will have the opportunity to select the theme which best fits your presentation farther down this form. The CEC Conference planning committee reserves the right to reassign presentations for better fit.

Theme #1: Rethink/Reframe Your Entrepreneurial Opportunities

Guiding Question: How can one get "unstuck" in thinking and doing to be open to opportunities and potential success?

Summary: Rethinking or reframing involves critically evaluating and reassessing current business ideas, strategies, and market conditions to identify new possibilities for growth and innovation. This process can include analyzing shifts in consumer behavior, emerging technologies, and competitive landscapes. It encourages entrepreneurs to challenge their assumptions, explore alternative approaches, and adopt a more flexible mindset. By doing so, they can uncover untapped markets, improve existing products or services, and develop more effective business models, ultimately enhancing their chances of success in a dynamic environment.

Theme #2: Remove Barriers to Entrepreneurial Success

Guiding Question: What are some solutions to common business barriers?

Summary: Innovation can be fostered by removing bureaucratic red tape, reducing financial constraints, and improving access to resources and mentorship. Whether you're a grant-making organization or a financial institution, supporting entrepreneurs through positive thinking and a supportive environment is key. This approach helps them focus on their goals, seize opportunities, and enhance creativity, ultimately leading to greater confidence and sustainable success. Addressing these barriers allows all entrepreneurs, particularly those from underrepresented backgrounds, to navigate challenges more effectively, pursue their visions with greater confidence, and significantly increase their chances of achieving sustainable success. Inclusive growth is not only beneficial for the individuals involved but also contributes to a more innovative and resilient economy.

Theme #3: Reignite Your Passion and Purpose

Guiding Question: How can I maintain my passion for and find purpose in my business in a dynamic and ever-changing 21st Century economy?

Guiding Question: How can networking and mentorship enhance entrepreneurial opportunities across generations, including Gen Z, while inspiring individuals to thrive and contribute positively to their local communities?
