## Keynote Speaker



### **CHADWICK HIGGINS**

Interim Vice Chancellor for Extension and Engagement University of Missouri Interim Chief Engagement Officer UM System

Chadwick Higgins is interim vice chancellor for extension and engagement at the University of Missouri. He also serves as interim chief engagement officer for the University of Missouri System.

In these roles since January 2023, Dr. Higgins provides leadership for continuing education programs across the state and university-wide engagement in coordination with leaders at all four system universities. He also plays a key role in evolving the land-grant mission of the university to meet the changing needs of Missourians.

Previously, Dr. Higgins served as associate vice chancellor overseeing the day-to-day programmatic and administrative components of the educational programs and initiatives for the MU Office of Extension and Engagement. He worked to support innovative, relevant programming and partnerships to solve Missouri's grand challenges related to the economy, education and health.

Before coming to Missouri, Dr. Higgins served as senior director of Iowa State University Extension and Outreach. He also brings more than 20 years of extensive teaching, mentoring, curriculum development, evaluation and reporting experience from past roles at Louisiana State University, West Virginia and Idaho State universities and their extension and outreach components. He has a doctorate in higher education administration from Louisiana State University.

He and his wife, Dell, have three sons. They enjoy spending considerable time outdoors hiking, fishing and playing and also really enjoy traveling the state.

## Keynote Speaker



### **COLONEL GORDON R. MEYER**

Vice Commander 131st Bomb Wing Whiteman Air Force Base

Col. Gordon R. Meyer serves as the Vice Commander for the 131st Bomb Wing, Whiteman Air Force Base, Missouri. In this capacity, he is second in command of the National Guard's only B-2 Spirit stealth bomber wing providing combat-ready Airmen for both state and federal missions. He is additionally responsible for the Air National Guard's B-2 and T-38 Talon aircraft operations.

Col. Meyer is a 1993 graduate of The Wichita State University with a Bachelor of Science in Industrial Technology. He has an extensive background in aircraft maintenance from his time with the Kansas Air National Guard working on F-4, F-16, and B-1 aircraft. He received his commission with the Missouri Air National Guard's 139th Airlift Wing in February 1995.

In April 1995, Col. Meyer was assigned to a command position as a Drill Status Guardsman for the 139th Logistics Support Flight. April 2002 joined the Advanced Airlift Tactics Training Center. During this time, he initiated the development and execution of the AATTC Night Vision Goggle Ground Operations Course in direct support to Operation Iragi Freedom. Col. Meyer moved to the 139th Maintenance Group in 2005 and eventually commanded at the flight, squadron, and group levels, supervising maintenance of C-130H aircraft. He deployed in support of operations Coronet Oak, Southern Watch, and several ties for Operations Enduring Freedom. As the 139th Mission Support Group Commander, he participated in the initial planning and established ground support requirements for both the C-130H Weapons Instructor Course and the first ANG Open Skies Treaty location. Col. Meyers re-energized the Base Master Plan for the 139AW, setting the unit on course for relocation and expansion of all wing facilities. Col. Meyer then served as the Director of Staff for the Missouri Air National Guard and was the full time Air Advisor to the Adjutant General and the Assistant Adjutant General - Air. He was also responsible for MONG Air Staff Oversight and planning for utilization of MOANG resources for domestic operations. Prior to his current position, the colonel served as the Vice Commander, 139th Airlift Wing, Rosecrans Municipal Airport, St. Joseph, Missouri.

## Keynote Speaker



### **ROB RUSSELL** Senior Program Director University of Missouri Extension Business & Communities Program

Rob Russell is an Assistant Extension Professor at the University of Missouri and serves at the Senior Program Director of University of Missouri Extension's Business & Communities Program. In this role, he provides leadership for Extension's programs in Business Development, Community Development, Labor and Workforce Development, and Regional Economic Development.

Prior to moving into this role, he has served as the Education Director of Extension's Labor and Workforce Development Program. His academic work focuses broadly on workforce issues facing the state of Missouri, including workforce trends and the ways communities and businesses can tackle those trends; labor and employment law; and Extension's role in workforce development.

He holds a Bachelor's degree in Geography from the University of Missouri; a Master's in Geography from the University of Alabama; and a PhD in Geography from the University of Iowa.






