NATIONAL 40 UNDER 40 WINNERS

Two Missouri SBDC team members were recognized as Top 40 Under 40 Young Professionals by America's SBDC in the award's inaugural year.

America's SBDC launched the Top 40 Under 40 Young Professionals Award, a recognition of SBDC staff from across the national network who demonstrate innovation, leadership, and commitment to the SBDC mission.

Travin Shelton launched a program in 2020 named Elevate. The first cohort began in early 2021 supporting growing businesses coming out of the pandemic. The program is bringing the Missouri SBDC credibility



and the attention of businesses that have opportunities for high growth, which contributes to more jobs supported and increased sales. The program has been so successful that it has become a part of the Missouri SBDC's annual grant proposal.

Sherry Noller has shown incredible drive and initiative as she moved into a leadership role far beyond the expectations of the associate state



director and marketing and communications director. During the global pandemic, she stepped up without being asked to serve a leadership role that allowed the Missouri SBDC to be a better organization coming out of the pandemic. In addition,

DIVERSITY, EQUITY, & INCLUSION

The Missouri SBDC has taken steps to ensure diverstiy, equity, and inclusion is woven into how we serve clients and our team around the state.

Led by Lynette Watson, Regional Director in St. Louis, the DEI committee prepares bi-weekly educational presentations for the network and in 2022 committee members completed the certified diversity and inclusion professional credentials.

INTERNATIONAL TRADE

In 2022, international trade director, Leslie Fischer, furthered the awareness of Missouri SBDC services and through many partnerships. Fischer was appointed by the U.S. Secretary of Commerce to the Missouri District Export Council where she has gotten involved as the Outreach Chairperson. In addition, Fischer led efforts to be involved in the Heartland Export Accelerator launch with tthe World Trade Center



Kansas City and Kansas SBDC. As part of this activity Fischer was able to further the awareness of the export planning template that she developed and work with software company LivePlan to include in their business planning tool.

Lastly, the Missouri Department of Agriculture Domestic and International Trade program facilitated an international trade mission from Taiwan in 2022. The Missouri SBDC assisted this state-level trade activity by providing follow-up resources and trade assistance to all domestic suppliers on a trade mission focused on value added grain, wine and liquor export.



GROWTH

Over the past two years, a group of 22 second-stage Missouri small businesses increased sales by \$10.7 million, made capital investments of \$8.2 million, and added 74 jobs. These businesses were beneficiaries of research and advice from leading experts in a customized consulting program called Elevate. Targeted at second-stage businesses, Elevate is sponsored by the Missouri SBDC.

TECHNOLOGY/INNOVATION

In FY22, the Missouri SBDC tech team and network served 338 technology clients through one-on-one business counseling and training. These clients reported receiving \$6,492,895 in grants, investments and/or equity.

The Missouri SBDC was awarded a second year of funding for the FAST grant. This allows the network to continue working with innovators that are seeking SBIR and STTR funding from various federal agencies.


